NOTE: Above product shows how Airmen / their families were assisted by the Air Force Aid Society (AFAS) at this installation.

It is easiest to read this starting from the bottom of the page:

- TOTAL AFAF CAMPAIGN PLEDGES reflects the total dollar amount Airmen pledged during the 2014 AF Assistance Fund

(AFAF) Campaign. Historically, the actual amount collected is ~7% less than the amount pledged.

- TOTAL AFAS DESIGNATED PLEDGE reflects how much of the total AFAF campaign dollars pledged (see above) was

designated by Airmen to the Air Force Aid Society (AFAS). NOTE: there are 4 charities: AFAS, Air Force Village, Air Force

Enlisted Village, and the General and Mrs. Curtis E. LeMay Foundation. Again, history shows that the actual amount collected

was ~7% less than the amount pledged.

- TOTAL for the named installation (3rd figure from the bottom) reflects how much the Air Force Aid Society (AFAS) supported

this installation's Airmen / Airmen's families through Emergency Assistance loans and / or grants, through Community

Programs offered at no cost (grant), and through Education Program grants and loans. The breakout of
